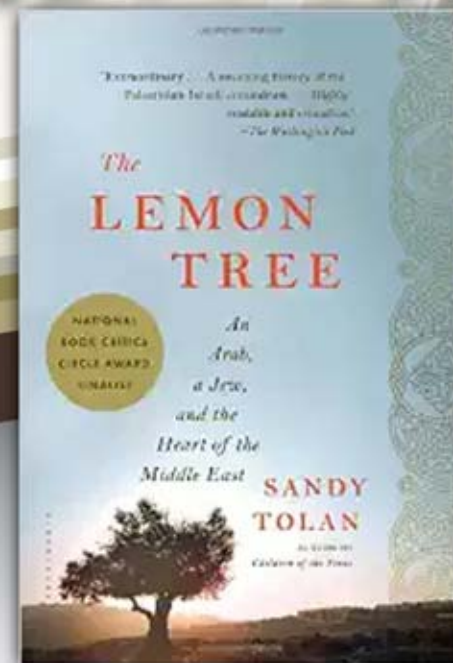


In 1967, a Palestinian Bashir Al-Khayri, journeyed to Israel, with the goal of seeing the beloved old stone house, with the lemon tree behind it, that he and his family had fled. To his surprise, he was greeted by Dalia Ashkenazi Landau, an Israeli college student, whose family fled Europe for Israel following the Holocaust. Dalia and Bashir began a rare friendship, forged in the aftermath of war and tested over the next thirty-five years.

Springing from his enormously resonant documentary that aired on NPR's Fresh Air in 1998, Sandy Tolan brings the Israeli-Palestinian conflict down to its most human level, suggesting that even amid the bleakest political realities there exist stories of hope and reconciliation.
